### **Key points**

- \*Create a relationship with your student, demonstrate being trustworthy, model behavior, hold them accountable.
- \*Assess your student, what are their goals, what they want to accomplish? What are their significant barriers to learning? ADHD, Executive Function, Dyslexia?
- \*CCLC Learner Contract + they arrive on time, prepared with their materials, keep their materials organized, have their homework completed or at <u>least</u> attempted.
- \*Help <u>them</u> create Learning/Study Plan -how do they learn, organize their time and study materials. Sometimes it can be as basic as they do not bring their binder, folder, books, pencils, writing utensils to a tutoring session.
- \*Help <u>them</u> develop and maintain a network of services and support such as ABE/GED teacher, <u>student</u> must be the one to contact the Adult Education office at CSM (301) 301-539-4874.

Ducksters.com- This site has different subjects from English grammar to science to history. I've primarily used the history lessons because I like the texts with comprehension questions. I haven't tried the grammar on this site.

bogglesworldesl.com- This site has worksheets and quizzes designed for ESL students. It also has listening practice.

ITESLJ.org- This site has articles for teachers, lesson plans, ideas, and handouts for ESL.

esl-lab.com- This site has lots of listening exercises.

test-english.com- This site has grammar, listening, reading, writing, and leveled tests.

games4esl.com- Who doesn't like using games to reinforce lessons?

a4esl.org- This site has leveled grammar and vocabulary quizzes, and crossword puzzles.

excellentesl4u.com- This site has conversation cards, flashcards, listening, reading, vocabulary, writing, and worksheets.

myenglishpages.com- This site has grammar, vocabulary, reading, speaking, listening, and writing practice for ESL student

usalearns.org- I haven't taught from this site, but it's a self-study course for immigrants preparing for their US citizenship exam.

Be careful when typing in the names of the websites. I've sometimes left out a letter or number and been taken to a completely different domain.

I hope your tutors and students find these sites helpful. Often, I'll simply search for a particular topic (for example: present perfect tense or how to prepare for a job interview) that I'm covering with my students and will find lots of information on different websites.
